There were a couple of planning meetings that all members did not attend. They helped

greatly in helping us figure out what was needed for the Crab Feed. Lions Bob & Zenaida Lawhon, Steve Martin, Bob Fenech, George Salet, and Lyle Workman were able to obtain all the necessary, and wanted, items for the feed. Lion Bob Fenech handled most of the food needs. Setting up the hall went very smoothly with the help of several Lions, including all those named, plus Bill Graziano.

By the time guests starting to show up, between 5:30 and 5:45, everything was set. The crab was already in the trays, salad

ready, and pasta was in the final stages of being prepared. Just about everyone coming was ready to eat on time, about 6:30. Serving went smoothly, although a few more members would have been a good thing.

Lion Bob Lawhon and Suzie Moy had raffle duty and did a spectacular job. The five cash prizes were quickly drawn and awarded toward the end of the feed. Lion Carol Fung, with the San Francisco Unified Lions Club, won the top prize of \$200 and surprised us by donating back half of the prize back to us, which help the Crab Feed be even more successful. another member and attendee

also made separate donations: George Salet \$10. and Jim Lobao \$60.

In all, 113 were at the event bringing in \$7,910. With the donations noted above, the raffle bringing in \$1,000, the total income was \$9,080. After all the food, drinks, hall rental, raffle prizes, and supplies were paid for, our net for the event is \$4,315.08.

Once again, thank you to all who helped, attended, donated, and worked up a sweat in making our 37th Annual Castagnetto / Spediacci Crab Feed a great success.


